Instructions for Contributors

The Journal of the Centre for Freudian Analysis and Research (**JCFAR**) is a peer-reviewed psychoanalytic journal, published annually, comprising a diverse range of essays, interviews and book reviews. We particularly welcome papers with a clinical focus and which take into account concepts and perspectives associated with Freudian/Lacanian psychoanalysis.

Authors should submit prospective JCFAR articles in Microsoft Word format, emailed to Sam Palmer at editor@jcfar.org

We welcome papers of varying lengths but would ask contributors to adhere to an upper limit of about 7000 words.

Papers should include endnotes, not footnotes.

In-text references should be shown as follows: (Lacan 1988) or (Lacan 1988, pp. 45-47).

The list of references should be given in alphabetical order at the end of the article, after the endnotes, using one of the main versions of Harvard style, as in the following examples:

Sole-authored book: Jacobsen, E. (1971) *Depression*. New York: International Universities Press

Chapter or paper in edited collection: Badiou, A. (2006) Lacan and the Pre-Socratics. In S. Zizek (ed.), *Lacan: The Silent Partners*. London: Verso

Journal article: Perry, C. (2001) What Health Care Assistants Know about Clean Hands. In *Nursing Times* 97(22): 63-64

Where available, English translations of original foreign-language texts should be cited, with the original foreign-language publication date cited in brackets. For example:

Lacan, J. (1988 [1975]) The Seminar of Jacques Lacan. Book I: Freud's Papers on Technique. New York: Norton

Papers by Sigmund Freud should be referenced as in the following example:

Freud, S. (1920g) *Beyond the Pleasure Principle*, SE 18. London: Hogarth
